- 1. The Wildlife Research and Training Institute (WRTI) is a Corporate Body in the State Department for Wildlife, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife. It was established under Article 50 of the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act No. 47 of 2013, and operationalized through Gazette Notice No. of 17th July, 2020. pursuant to Section 60(1) of the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act No. 47 of 2013, whose mandate is to undertake and coordinate wildlife research and training in the country. WRTI is charged with managing all wildlife data and information, and grants wildlife user rights through the issuance of research permits.
- 2. The Institute now invites eligible consulting firms ("Consultants") to indicate their interest providing the Services. Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. The shortlisting criteria on required qualifications and experience of the firm are:
 - i. Experience in the assignment, including technical and managerial capability of the firm.
 - ii. Number of years in business working on the area of the assignment.
 - iii. Reference to at least three assignments of similar nature and size carried out in the last (5) years. Include persons or institutions and contact addresses (phone, email) who can be contacted on the same.
- 3. The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to the following provisions that will be highlighted in the Request for Proposals to be issued to shortlisted firms.
 - a. The Consultant will be expected to have no conflict of interest with other assignments or its own corporate interests and act without any consideration for future work.
 - b. The consultant has no personal or business relationship with the Procuring Entity's senior management or professional staff.
 - c. A firm or an individual in the firm has not been <u>sanctioned</u> by the Public ProcurementRegulatory Institute or is under a suspension or debarment imposed by any other entity of the Government of Kenya, or any international organization.
 - d. Government-owned enterprises or institutions of Kenya Government, officials and civil servants and employees of public institutions may not be eligible.
- 4. DO NOT submit financial statements at this stage
- 5. Consultants may associate with other firms to enhance their qualifications, but should indicate clearly whether the association is in the form of a joint venture and/or a sub-consultancy. In the case of a joint venture, all the partners in the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable for the entire contract, if selected.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

SUMMARY OF TOR

The Wildlife Research and Training Institute with financial support from Tourism Development Trust Fund is seeking a consultant to develop structural designs for a National Marine Public Aquarium, identify the suitable site and develop a sustainable business and operating plan.

BACKGROUND

WRTI is a Government corporate body established under Article 50 of the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act 2013 under Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife whose mandate is to undertake and coordinate wildlife research and training in the country. WRTI is charged with managing all wildlife data and information, and grants wildlife user rights through the issuance of research permits.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposal seeks to establish a National Aquarium to showcase Kenya's rich marine biodiversity comprising marine flora and fauna. This project shall contribute largely towards a sustainable Blue Economy agenda for Kenya. The National Aquarium, apart from its commercial supremacy, should have alliances with the Universities and Marine Biology Research Centers to undertake marine biological research projects in collaboration with similar reputed centers around the world. The research findings shall provide a revenue base.

This attraction mentally and visually removes the viewing public from their everyday environment and transports them to the bottom of the ocean. The development of strategic and suitable display, exhibits, touch pools, aquarium designs to showcase diverse marine species, and artifacts shall include the main oceanarium tank of multiple marine species and plants with a submerged acrylic tunnel. Within the tank, a complete marine ecosystem shall be established where the rockwork and general layout of the tank reflects ocean conditions giving visitors a clear understanding of the marine environment. An elaborate marine life support system should be developed to ensure the long-term sustainable operation of the aquarium. This system shall consider the availability of sea water of suitable quality for the operation of the aquarium, waste and water filtering, recycling, and management.

The aquarium shall have a strong research and educational emphasis, with contemporary laboratories and research facilities to host a modern research center.

CONSULTANCY OBJECTIVE

This assignment seeks to develop designs for a National Marine Public Aquarium in Mombasa, identify the suitable site and develop a sustainable business and operating plan.

The consultant will undertake the following specific activities: -

- Hold an inception meeting with WRTI team to get a clear understanding of WRTI's mission, vision, and goals for The Marine National Aquarium.
- Review existing literature on marine aquarium designs, financing, operation, and business plans.
- Document successful best practices, experiences and lessons learned, as well as entrenched challenges resulting from marine aquariums development, operations, and financing.
- Identify the right location for the aquarium in Mombasa, develop the appropriate designs, develop a financing plan and business plan.
- Conduct an assessment to understand the skills and capacities required for the successful establishment and operation of a marine aquarium.

DELIVERABLES

- Inception report and work plan describing proposed activities and timelines for carrying out the assignment.
- Presentation of the draft National Marine Aquarium design, suitable location, the financing mechanisms and the sustainable operation and business plan.

- Presentation of the Final National Marine Aquarium design, suitable location, the financing mechanisms and the sustainable operation and business plan. for validation

- Competence in marine engineering, marine ecology, marine life support systems, business development and management, project management, natural resources management or any other relevant field.

- Experience in conducting participatory qualitative and quantitative studies.
- Evidence of theoretical knowledge and practical application of cross-cutting issues in development such as youth and gender mainstreaming, blue economy, marine conservation, and investments.

vii) APPENDIX 1 - FRAUD AND CORRUPTION

(Appendix 1 shall not be modified)

1. Purpose

1.1 The Government of Kenya's Anti-Corruption and Economic Crime laws and their sanction's policies and procedures, Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act (no.33 of 2015) and its Regulation, and any other Kenya's Acts or Regulations related to Fraud and Corruption, and similar offences, shall apply with respect to Public Procurement Processes and Contracts that are governed by the laws of Kenya.

2. Requirements

- 2.1 The Government of Kenya requires that all parties including Procuring Entities, Tenderers, (applicants/proposers), Consultants, Contractors and Suppliers; any Sub-contractors, Sub-consultants, Service providers or Suppliers; any Agents (whether declared or not); and any of their Personnel, involved and engaged in procurement under Kenya's Laws and Regulation, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process, selection and contract execution of all contracts, and refrain from Fraud and Corruption and fully comply with Kenya's laws and Regulations as per paragraphs 1.1 above.
- 2.2 Kenya's public procurement and asset disposal act (no. 33 of 2015) under Section 66describes rules to be followed and actions to be taken in dealing with Corrupt, Coercive, Obstructive, Collusive or Fraudulent practices, and Conflicts of Interest inprocurement including consequences for offences committed. A few of the provisions noted below highlight Kenya's policy of no tolerance for such practices and behavior:
 - A person to whom this Act applies shall not be involved in any corrupt, coercive, obstructive, collusive or fraudulent practice; or conflicts of interest in any procurement or as set disposal proceeding;
 - 2) A person referred to under subsection (1) who contravenes the provisions of that sub-section commits an offence:
 - 3) Without limiting the generality of the subsection (1) and (2), the person shall be:
 - a) disqualified from entering into a contract for a procurement or assetdisposal proceeding; or
 - b) if a contract has already been entered into with the person, the contractshall be voidable;
 - 4) The voiding of a contract by the procuring entity under subsection (7) does not limit any legal remedy the procuring entity may have;
 - An employee or agent of the procuring entity or a member of the Board or committee of the procuring entity whohas a conflict of interest with respect to a procurement:
 - a) Shall not take part in the procurement proceedings;
 - b) shall not, after a procurement contract has been entered in to, take part inany decision relating to the procurement or contract; and

- c) shall not be a subcontract or for the tender to whom was awarded contract, or a member of the group of tenderers to whom the contract was awarded, but the subcontractor appointed shall meet all the requirements of this Act.
- An employee, agent or member described in subsection (1) who refrains from doing anything prohibited under that subsection, but for that subsection, would have been within his or her duties shall disclose the conflict of interest to the procuring entity;
- If a person contravenes subsection (1) with respect to a conflict of interest described in subsection (5)(a) and the contract is awarded to the person or his relative or to another person in whom one of them had a direct or indirect pecuniary interest, the contract shall be terminated and all costs incurred by the public entity shall be made good by the awarding officer. Etc.
- 3. In compliance with Kenya's laws, regulations and policies mentioned above, the ProcuringEntity:
 - a) Defines broadly, for the purposes of the above provisions, the terms setforth below as follows:
 - i) "corrupt practice" is the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence improperly the actions of another party;
 - ii) "fraudulent practice" is any act or omission, including is representation, that knowingly or recklessly misleads, or attempts to mislead, a party to obtain financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation:
 - "collusive practice" is an arrangement between two or more parties designed to achieve an improper purpose, including to influence improperly the actions of another party; "coercive practice" is impairing orharming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any partyor the property of the party to influence improperly the actions of a party;
 - iv) "obstructive practice" is:
 - Deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering, or concealing of evidence material to the
 investigation or making false statements to investigators order to materially impede
 investigation by Public Procurement Regulatory Institute(PPRA) or any other
 appropriate Instituteappointed by Government of Kenya into allegations of a corrupt,
 fraudulent, coercive, or collusive practice; and/or threatening, harassing, or intimidating
 any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the
 investigation or from pursuing theinvestigation; or
 - acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the PPRA's or the appointed authority's inspection and audit rights provided for under paragraph 2.3 e. below.
 - b) Defines more specifically, in accordance with the above procurement Act provisions set forth for fraudulent and collusive practices as follows:

"fraudulent practice" includes a misrepresentation of fact in order to influencea procurement or disposal process or the exercise of a contract to the detriment of the procuring entity or the tenderer or the contractor, and includes collusive

practices amongst tenderers prior to or after tender submission designed to establish tender prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the procuring entity of the benefits of free and open competition.

- c) Rejects a proposal for award 1 of a contract if PPRA determines that the firm or individual recommended for award, any of its personnel, or its agents, or its sub-consultants, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/ or their employees, has, directly or indirectly, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices in competing for the contract in question;
- d) Pursuant to the Kenya's above stated Acts and Regulations, may recommend toappropriate Institute(ies) for sanctioning and debarment of a firm or individual, asapplicable under the Acts and Regulations;
- e) Requires that a clause be included in Tender documents and Request forProposal documents requiring(i) Tenderers (applicants/proposers), Consultants, Contractors, and Suppliers, and their Sub-contractors, Sub- consultants, Service providers, Suppliers, Agents personnel, permit the PPRA or any other appropriate Institute appointed by Government of Kenya to inspect² all accounts, records and other documents relating to the procurementprocess, selection and/or contract execution, and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the PPRA or any other appropriate Institute appointed by Government of Kenya; and
- f) Pursuant to Section 62 of the above Act, requires Applicants/Tenderers to submit along with their Applications/Tenders/Proposals a "Self-Declaration Form" as included in the procurement document declaring that they and all parties involved in the procurement process and contract execution have not engaged/will not engage in any corrupt or fraudulent practices.

¹For the avoidance of doubt, a party's in eligibility to be awarded a contract shall include, without limitation, (i) applying for pre-qualification, expressing interest in a consultancy, and tendering, either directly or as a nominated sub-contractor, nominated consultant, nominated manufacturer or supplier, or nominated service provider, in respect of such contract, and (ii) entering into an addendum or amendment introducing material modification to any existing contract.

² Inspections in this context usually are investigative (i.e., forensic) in nature. They involve fact-finding activities undertaken by the Investigating Instituteor persons appointed by the Procuring Entity to address specific matters related to investigations/audits, suc has evaluating the veracity of an allegation of possible Fraud and Corruption, through the appropriate mechanisms.
